#### Introduction to Summer Modules

This year, Succeed2gether started a pilot summer enrichment program that featured nine fun and exciting weeklong classes for students. These free or low-cost classes were on subjects such as math and language arts enrichment for younger children (grades 1-3) at the Montclair Public Library, that also offered the kids free lunch and reading time with a book buddy, a popular class on video game animation, as well as one on app design, robotics and drones. There were also entertaining classes on story illustration and creative writing for elementary and middle school students. Chess and spoken word poetry were also offered.
